What sounds do you hear when walking through the leaves? | Can you write an Autumn Poem? Use junk or instruments to add sound to your poem.   |
| Write your own Percy story (pictures, story map or scribing by parents)  | Make a crumble! Weigh, measure and follow the recipe.                | Visit Okehampton Park- try to find where Percy the Park keeper lives. Follow the trails and collect things you see make it in to a collage map. | Collect different leaves and 'signs' of autumn. Can you make a collage using the things you have found?                  | Find an Autumn Poem Can you practise saying it? If you feel confident you could say it to the class or make a video to show. |
