Verbal I enjoy reading, writing and speaking.	Mathematical I enjoy working with numbers and science.	Visual I enjoy painting, drawing and visualising.	Kinaesthetic I enjoy creating.	Musical I enjoy making and listening to music.
Imagine yourself living in Britain when the Romans arrived. Write a letter or diary explaining how you feel about the Romans invading your tribe.	Create a poster to help explain Roman numerals. Think about the presentation and keep it accurate.	Create a Roman mosaic. Think carefully about the colours and shapes they would have used.	Make a model of Roman baths. 	Compose or learn a piece of music that makes you think of a Roman army marching into battle. Record it, or video it, or be prepared to perform it to the class.
Research information about the Roman gods and goddesses. Produce an information page about them.	Collect and gather number facts about the Romans. Create a 'fact sheet' with loads of number facts about anything relating to the Romans.	Find an image of a Roman coin. Copy and draw a picture of a Roman coin. Label your drawing with a sentence to explain it.	Design and make your own Roman artefact. Invent an artefact that could go into a Roman exhibition/museum.	Learn or write your own poem about Roman life to perform to the class.

Remember to hear your child(ren) read as much as possible, ideally every day, and then record it in their Reading Diary.

Please work on fast recall of number bonds to 10, 20 and 100. Doubling 2-digit numbers.

Please work on times tables and spellings.
