





# One small step for man, one giant leap for mankind - Home learning grid



The children are expected to complete three tasks from the top row before half term and three from the bottom row after half term. The children can pick which tasks they would like to complete, allowing them more ownership of their work and more time to complete the tasks to a good standard.

It should be noted that the children are still expected to read every day and practise their times tables regularly (up to 12 x 12).

<p>Write a diary entry for an astronaut who is about to go into space. Would they be nervous or excited? What might they be thinking / feeling?</p> 	<p>Keep a record of the phases of the moon over a month. Can you name the different phases?</p> 	<p>Design and draw your own Space Shuttle. What shape would it be? What colour would it be? What special features would it possess?</p> 	<p>Make a model of our solar system.</p> 	<p>Find or compose a piece of music that reminds you of one of the planets. Why does this make you think about this particular planet?</p>
<p>Write a weather poem and perform it to the class.</p> 	<p>Draw a graph to show the average rainfall and temperatures for each month in the UK and a contrasting country of your choice.</p>	<p>Design an outfit to be worn in a specific climate - eg a polar suit. Label each part of your outfit explanations about how it works and the benefits to the wearer.</p>	<p>Make a model of the water cycle.</p> 	<p>Compose some music or a soundscape which makes you think of rainy, stormy skies. You can email the track to school or perform it in class. You can use improvised instruments, body percussion or real instruments.</p>

Tasks should be handed in when completed and will be shared in class once a week. Your child is welcome to do more tasks if they choose! They will be given brief feedback and team points for their contributions each half term.
