




Anglo Saxons and Vikings - Home learning grid



The children are expected to complete three tasks from the top row before half term and three from the bottom row after half term. The children can pick which tasks they would like to complete, allowing them more ownership of their work and more time to complete the tasks to a good standard.

It should be noted that the children are still expected to read every day and practise their times tables regularly (up to 12 x 12).

Where did the Vikings go? The Vikings came from what we now call Scandinavia, but explored and travelled far and wide. Research some of the places that they reached. How far did they go? Were they always unwelcome raiders?	Viking blacksmiths made things out of iron. Iron starts off as a rock that is melted using fire. Then, the iron is beaten with a hammer to make things, for example a horseshoe, a knife or an axe. We can use a hammer to change the shape of some hard materials. Other materials don't change their shape, they just shatter. Can we make a table of different materials to show the effect of hitting them with a hammer? Can you think of other ways to change the shape of a material apart from hitting it with a hammer?	Viking art Create a collage or painting of Beowulf or the monster Grendel. How do you think he would have looked?	Make a Viking object. This could be a tool, household object, item of jewellery etc. Or even some Viking food for a Viking banquet.	Listen to Loki the Joker and learn the words. Loki the Joker Music
