What's the population? How tall is the highest building? How long ago did people begin to live in Exeter?	Draw, paint, craft a map of Exeter including key landmarks.	Visit the Underground passages in Exeter and find out what these were used for.	Learn and sing some nursery rhymes and find out why the songs and rhymes came about and what they meant.
Can you write a letter, or make a poster to help save the planet from too much plastics? May be write to a supermarket to ask them to stop using plastic packaging or make a poster helping other people find ways to use less.	Can you grow some seeds and measure them regularly maybe keep a chart of how quickly they grew?	Can you paint, draw or craft some flowers, plants or trees ?	Take the train to Exeter or walk down to the river. Find out where the river ends maybe get the train all the way to Exmouth.	Can you make a musical instrument using natural materials? Could be plants, wood, vegetables etc....
