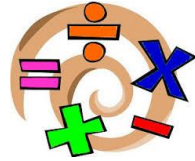




Year 4: Ancient Egypt - Home learning grid



The children are expected to complete four tasks in all, two from the top row before half term and two from the bottom row after half term. The children can pick which tasks they would like to complete. Please make sure that your child is also reading every day.

Verbal I enjoy reading, writing and speaking.	Mathematical I enjoy working with mathematics and science.	Visual I enjoy painting, drawing and visualising.	Kinaesthetic I enjoy doing hands-on activities.	Musical I enjoy making and listening to music.
Imagine you have just discovered an Ancient Egyptian tomb. Write a description of what it is like as you walk through.	Draw and label a map of Egypt, including some of the physical features such as the Nile.	Create a portrait of an Egyptian God or Goddess.	Can you make some Egyptian style jewellery? Look carefully at the colours used.	Compose a poem or song about the gods and goddesses of Ancient Egypt.
Imagine you are a piece of food and explain the journey through the digestive system!	Use a Venn diagram to compare the different types of teeth that various animals have.	Make a poster explaining how to keep your teeth and mouth healthy.	Make a model of the human mouth! Can you show the different teeth and explain what they are used for?	Compose a song or poem about teeth!
