




Where My Wellies Take Me - Home learning grid



Homework activities for this term. The children can pick which tasks they would like to complete, allowing them more ownership of their work and more time to complete the tasks to a good standard. During the term they should complete at least 3 different jobs from this list.

It should be noted that the children are still expected to read every day and practise their times tables regularly (focus on 2, 5 and 10).

Verbal I enjoy reading, writing and speaking.	Mathematical I enjoy working with mathematics and science.	Visual I enjoy painting, drawing and visualising.	Kinaesthetic I enjoy doing hands-on activities.	Musical I enjoy making and listening to music.
Create a scrapbook page, like we've seen in our book, about a walk you go on with your family, add photos, relevant poems, sketches and writing about what you did.	Create a graph of animals or plants that you have spotted around home or on a walk.	Draw, paint or create a collage of a countryside scene.	Use some natural items e.g. leaves, pebbles, sticks etc. to create a sculpture or a picture on the ground. Take a photo if it's too big to bring in.	Compose or learn a piece of music that reminds you of a walk in the woods to perform to the class.
Read an information text about British wildlife or plants and create your own fact page to show what you have found out.	Create a key to help us identify trees or plants when out on a wellie ramble.	Take some photographs of wildlife - be prepared to explain a little about the creatures you have photographed.	Make a 3D model of a British animal.	Find a poem that you like and learn to perform it in a musical way, eg. Add instruments or sing it to a tune, etc.
