Music is taught once a week with 40 minute lessons taught by class teachers. Our musical learning is further supplemented by a whole school singing assembly once a week for 30 minutes.

Children have the opportunity to learn instruments as part of a whole class, provided by the Devon Music Education Hub. Previous opportunities have included Gamelan and Taiko drums.

Extra-Curricular Music

At Copplestone Primary School, we currently offer individual or small groups lessons on guitar, drums, keyboard or flute through the Devon Music Education Hub. Children are taught in a dedicated music practise room.

We have two choirs for each Key Stage that meets weekly. They play a key role in our Carol Concert during the Winter term as well as performing at local venues.

Individual and small group lessons are funded by parents, however for those children who are in receipt of Pupil Premium funding, these lessons can be funded by the Pupil Premium provision.

Musical Events

Children have the opportunity to perform in various musical events at Copplestone and within the community including nativities, carol concerts, end of year musicals, and music assemblies.



Experiences of high-quality performances in the past have included Taiko workshops, trips to the theatre to see 'The Snail and the Whale', 'Dear Santa' and 'Hansel and Gretl'. Further opportunities have included a 'Summer Sounds' event organised by the Devon Education Music Hub.
