Home learning:

Reading

Times Tables and Maths

Please practise at home until fluent. Each child should already have a login to Maths Shed where they can practise times tables.

Spelling

Each child will continue to have a login to Spelling Shed to practise spellings and revise patterns and rules. These rules will be taught in the lesson on Monday and recapped and practised throughout the week.

Revision

Homework expectations will also shift towards 1 hour of independent revision a week to help with our preparation for the key stage 2 SATs in May. In the coming weeks in class we will make timetables and discuss what revision might look like. We will also be sending out a letter shortly with an order form to request revision guides purchased through the school at a discounted rate.
